EST 2021**

The NNYS Hockey League St Lawrence River Valley Division, or "SLRV" or "League" is subject to all the rules, regulations and policies of the New York State Amateur Hockey Associations, Inc. (N.Y.S.A.H.A.) and U.S.A. Hockey Inc. The following rules and regulations may further restrict those rules.

- 1) **Board of Directors:** Shall be comprised of one representative from each association that enters a team at any level in any given season. This Board will be advised and overseen by the NYSAHA North Section Central Area Vice President. Any decisions not specifically outlined in these rules are at the discretion of the Board of Directors (BOD). Any vote by the Board of Directors will pass by simple majority and the North Section President will serve as the appeal authority.
- 2) **Season:** The Board of Directors shall determine the exact date of the season for all divisions, as designated by NYSAHA Guidebook.
 - A. Each team must meet ALL league commitments. Any team and/or association may be disqualified or suspended from the League by the Board, pending the outcome of a hearing, for not meeting league commitment(s).
 - B. Playdowns take precedence over any other commitments and no association shall schedule other conflicting play during these times. Playdown schedule/locations will be determined by BOD, on an as needed basis.
 - C. Any team that does not make the necessary schedule accommodations to play all required games will have failed to meet the requirements to be eligible for the end of season playdown weekend and will be excluded. There will be no exceptions
- 3) **League Membership:**
 - A. All organizations must be members in good standing with USAH and NYSAHA to participate in the League.
 - B. These rules apply to SLRV League only.
 - C. All individual participants and teams in the league shall be properly registered with USA Hockey before the start of the league season.
 - D. Participants and teams will adhere to the classifications of USA Hockey. The classifications of a player shall be determined by his/her age at midnight on December 31st prior to or during the current playing season.
 - E. There will be a \$50 fee per team.
- 4) **Team Declarations:**
 - A. **Team Declaration:** Each Association shall inform the League of their intention to register a team and the division in which they will play by the following dates: These dates are final dates to declare. No late declarations shall be accepted.

For a team declaration to be official a roster must be submitted to the North Section Registrar for approval by the declaration date.

Final management and coordination of divisions will be subject to the BOD.

- B. Declarations will be considered official when a roster is approved and all team information has been entered on the NNYSHL website <https://www.nnyshl.com/index.php>

5) **Rosters:**

A. General Information

- 1) All Players, coaches and manager must be properly rostered per USA Hockey and NYSAHA rules prior to participation in any team events. Any team(s) which begin league play and which have not registered with USAH and have not submitted a roster to the North Section registrar shall forfeit all league games prior to proper registration.
- 2) No roster may include players that are also rostered on Tournament Bound Team or players that are rostered in more than one association. If an association contains full season teams at multiple competitive levels and a player is rostered on the upper level (select) team they are ineligible to participate in this league. This League is for the sole purpose of providing opportunities for “House” players.

*Exception for 10U only: Due to limited availability of girls teams a 10U may be rostered in more than one association if one of the teams is a girls team.

B. Roster Changes:

- 1) Player movement and roster changes cannot be made after December 1st unless approved by the BOD.
- 2) All changes will be final as of December 31st of the current playing season. No player changes on rosters will be allowed for any team after December 31st.

6) **Game Rules:**

- A. All games will be played per rules outlined in the USA Hockey rule book.
- B. All suspensions, imposed for incidents during a League game, must be served in league-games and/or the League Playdowns. Suspensions imposed in non-league games shall be served in the next scheduled game for the team even if that game is a league game. Refer to USA Hockey rule book for further information.

7) **League/Game Schedule/Playdowns:**

- A. All SLRV Division scores need to be submitted to the Northern New York State Hockey League website, <https://www.nnyshl.com/index.php>. The NNYSHL website will have game schedules and standings for the SLRV.
- B. The HOME team is responsible to add league games to the schedule on the NNYSHL website before the game is played and enter the final score immediately following game conclusion.
- C. All League games must be completed by the last Sunday in January.
- D. Playdowns will start February 1. The first two rounds will be played at the home of the higher seed and must be completed by the end of the second weekend in February. These games are to be scheduled at the convenience of the teams involved, if teams can't agree on a schedule the game will be scheduled by the North Section Central Area VP.
- E. Finals for all divisions will be the third weekend in February as determined by the BOD.
- F. Players must participate in 80% of a team's games to be eligible to participate in playdowns.

8) **Record Keeping Responsibilities:**

- A. Each registered team shall have a team manager. Each association shall appoint a League Representative. Contact information for the League Representative and team manager shall be provided to the SLRV at the time of team declaration. The team manager, who may also be a head coach or assistant coach, shall be responsible for all record keeping of the team and shall have access to all documents necessary for credential review, playdowns and championships. (Required forms can be obtained from the organization registrar and are also located on the NY Registrar website www.nyregistrar.com. Instructions on putting the credential book together can also be found on the NY Registrar website.)
- B. Player names on game_sheets must match names as listed on the approved roster.
- C. Association name, Team name and Team ID# as shown on the roster must be included on each game sheet.
- D. Game sheets for League games should also be kept by both the home and visiting team until the end of the season.
- E. Each HOME TEAM ONLY will report the final score of the game using website protocol **immediately following game**. Any score discrepancies must be reported to the North Section Central Area VP along with a copy of the scoresheet within 48 hours.

9) Home Team Responsibilities:

- A. Supplying a suitable ice surface with proper equipment and gender equitable locker rooms for the game of ice hockey.
- B. Provide USA Hockey registered referees from an independent Referee Organization. Every home team shall arrange for the referees. Relatives of participants, coaches or team members should not be refereeing these games. It is also advised that younger referees are accompanied by a senior referee over the age of 21. Organizations are to communicate this with their assignor. The number and level of referees are at the discretion of the area assignor.
- C. Providing the proper playing time for each age group as defined in these rules.
 - 1) Any Association unable to provide the required ice times should bring the problem to the SLRV BOD
 - 2) In order to aid in the completion of games, all teams will be limited to:
 - a. A three (3) minute on ice warm-up immediately following the exit of the Zamboni. The referee will call delay of game on any team not ready to play three (3) minutes after the ice has been resurfaced. The offending team then has two (2) minutes before a second delay of game is called. If the team is not ready after two (2) more minutes, the game is forfeited.
 - b. Each team will be granted (1) one minute time-out per game
- D. To maintain order and good behavior of the spectators and rink personnel.
 - 1) The League holds each member team/association responsible for policing the conduct of the coach, player, spectator, and parents at sanctioned events (games/practices).
 - 2) If the member team/association fails to act, the League reserves the right to have any person who causes a disturbance removed from the playing area.
 - 3) Parents or spectators who interfere with any game or become rowdy, obnoxious, abusive or exercises unsportsmanlike conduct in any way may be ejected from the arena and may be barred from further participation with the League.
 - 4) The referee may hold up the game until such person(s) are removed. Incidents of this nature will be noted by the referee on the official scoresheet and referred to the disciplinary panel for any necessary action. from competition. In ice arenas where referees go through a public area to the locker room, a team official should accompany them.
- E. To supply competent Off-Ice-Officials (18 years old minimum)- Including but not limited to timekeeper, scorekeeper, and a penalty box attendant for each box. (See USAHOCKEY Off-Ice Officials Guidebook for more information). Away team has the option to supply a penalty box supervisor and a scorekeeper, and these officials are to be in place before the start of any game. The Off-Ice-Officials responsibilities include:
 - 1) Knowledge of proper usage of the clock
 - 2) Proper procedure for keeping the scoresheet.
 - 3) Asking the referees to clarify any confusion with game procedures and penalties.
 - 4) To provide a qualified scorekeeper and timekeeper, penalty box supervisor and all needed facilities including an extra stopwatch, whistle and first aid kit.

10) Game Requirements:

In order for a League Game to be considered valid and recorded in our standings, it must meet the following (No Exceptions): No Overtime shall be played. Games shall start on fresh ice no ice resurfacing is allowed.

- A. 10U (3) 13 minute periods
- B. 12U/14U (3) 15 minute periods
- C. 12U/14U 2/5/10 minute penalties. 10U 1:30/4/8 minute penalties
- D. One minute break between each period

11) League Play/Divisions:

The League will consist of the following divisions: 10UA, 10UB, 10UC, 12U and 14U.

- A. Teams will play (2) games against all teams that have declared at their division.
 - 1) 12U and 14U will have from November 1 - final Sunday in January to complete these games.
 - 2) 10U will complete these games between November 1 and December 31. In the first week of January the BOD will re-evaluate the 10U divisions to make adjustments in the interest of creating equal divisions. After adjusting divisions 10U teams will play (1) game against each team in the new division to determine playdown seeding.
- B. If (8) or more teams declare in a division, the teams will be divided into two new divisions based on geography for league play. Teams must play two games against each team in their new division.
- C. If less than (8) teams declare, each team will play (2) games against each team at their classification.
- D. The end of season rankings will determine team placement for the end of season playdowns.
- E. Invitational Tournament games can count as a League game as long as both teams agree prior to game start and game length meets League requirements.

12) **Scoring/Tie-Breakers**

- A. A two-point scoring system for standings to will be used for all qualifying games: (As determined at the end of regulation time, no OT in League Q-games)
1. Win – 2 points
 2. Tie – 1 point
 3. Loss – 0 points
- B. Tie Breaking Policy (at the conclusion of regular season play)– The League will utilize the tie breaking policy recommended by NYSAHA which is detailed in the USA Hockey Tournament Guidebook (the guidebook can be found on the NYSAHA website –www.nysaha.com).

Note: NYSAHA North Section BOD will not apply or advise on any tiebreakers until the season is over and a tie actually exists between two or more teams in a division.

13) **Discipline:**

Any and all matters that involve game or match misconducts shall be reported to and reviewed by the North Section Central Area VP. If the North Section VP determines that supplementary discipline is needed that process will follow NYSAHA protocol as outlined in the NYSAHA Guidebook.

14) **Protests**

- A. A protest may only be lodged by an Association’s President. No protest may be lodged by a coach, manager or parent regardless of their position.
- B. The official USA Hockey playing rules shall be used. No Protests shall be permitted on the playing rules or for referee calls or penalties assessed before, during or after the game.
- C. The Association President shall notify the SLRV BOD of the impending protest within 24 hours of the completion of the game.
- D. All the facts of the incidents, including why the protest is being filed and the desired outcome need to be stated precisely in the protest. Do not be vague in any statements.
- E. Both parties will be notified of the decision of the BOD within 10 days.

15) **Disclaimer:**

In order to preserve, as far as possible, the integrity of amateur hockey and the League, any recourse to the courts or legal action by a member or individual before and/or during all the rights of the Bylaws and Rules & Regulations of this corporation have been exhausted, shall be considered ungentlemanly conduct entailing the immediate suspension and disqualification of any such member or individual(s). Refer to USA Hockey, Inc., Bylaws, Suspensions and Resolution of Disputes for additional information.

The SLRV BOD reserves the right to change and modify these rules at any time to promote the best interest of hockey in our Section.
